



ROYAL TUNBRIDGE WELLS TOWN FORUM

The following Aims and Objectives of the Town Forum were agreed at the full meeting on the 6 March 2008:

Aims

1. To work with the Tunbridge Wells Borough Council to achieve their objectives focusing on the immediate scheme of the “Master Plan” of Royal Tunbridge Wells.
2. To represent the best interests of residents of the town Royal Tunbridge Wells.
3. To promote more engagement with Kent County Council.

Objectives

- ❖ To see Royal Tunbridge Wells is becoming clear of “Grot Spots” and to see that promised revitalization in the town centre takes place with true partnership of residents. Priority being given to the Ritz Building Cinema site by the year 2010.
- ❖ The Town Forum shall promote the interests of local communities in the town of Royal Tunbridge Wells, the unparished part of the Borough of Tunbridge Wells.
- ❖ To ensure a mechanism be formally agreed for the Tunbridge Wells Borough Council to provide full responses to each and every paper/report submitted by the Town Forum; in particular the “Getting around Tunbridge Wells” paper and the “Position Statement on Planning” paper.
- ❖ Promoting and establishing a working relationship with Tunbridge Wells Borough Council to ensure Kent County Council provide their promised high standards regarding roads, pavements, streetlights and signs.
- ❖ To promote the Town Forum to all areas of Royal Tunbridge Wells and to expand relations and membership so as to ensure representation from a diverse cross-section of our community.
- ❖ To promote the interests of the Youth of Royal Tunbridge Wells and to act as a link for the new immigrant communities now growing within Royal Tunbridge Wells.

Strategy

The Town Forum wishes to become a focal point for views of the citizens of Royal Tunbridge Wells. It is the intention of the Town Forum to improve the living environment of all residents and workers within Royal Tunbridge Wells. We will achieve these goals by working with the Tunbridge Wells Borough Council and networking with all interested parties to bring forth a united voice.
