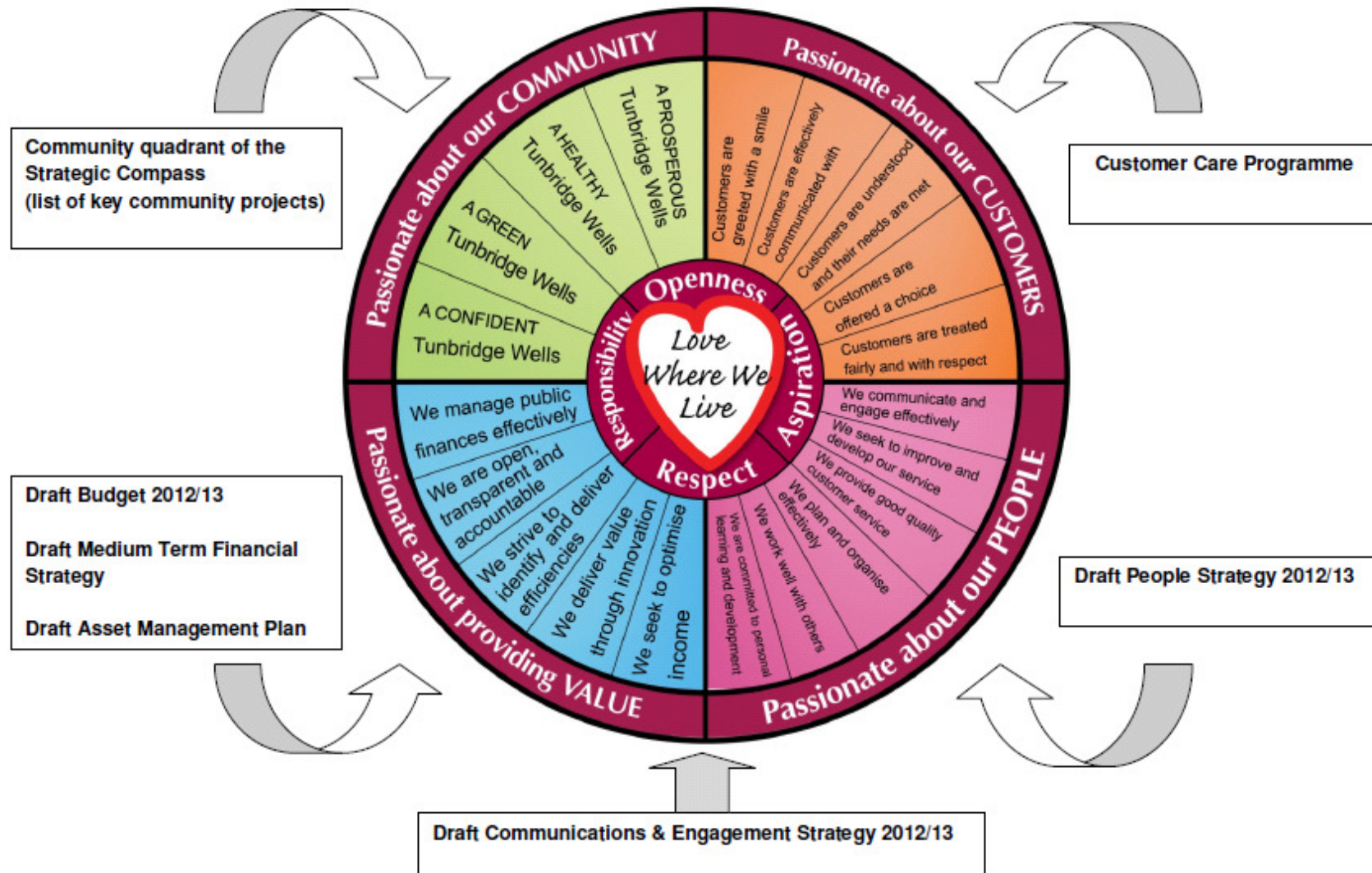
The Strategic Compass sets out the Council's commitment to delivering key projects and objectives under four key headings:

Strategic Compass



- Some of the projects we are looking to explore and deliver in Royal Tunbridge Wells as part of the community section include:
 - work with the new owners of the cinema site
 - work with the new owners of a 'Day at the Wells'
 - develop a management plan for Calverley Grounds
 - introduce a programme of environmental enhancements
 - work with Fusion to improve the local sport centres
 - deliver a programme of community grants
 - promoting a year of celebrations in 2012
 - new lift and public lavatory for the museum/art gallery

Vision for Kent 2012 - 2022



- The Vision for Kent is the overarching strategy for Kent County Council's policy framework
- It is Kent's Sustainable Community Strategy which sets out the long term ambitions and objectives for the county
- It has a ten year lifespan and was developed in association with district authorities and key partner agencies

Vision for Kent 2012 - 2022



- The Vision for Kent sets out three clear ambitions for the county over the next ten years:
 - » to grow the economy
 - » to tackle disadvantage
 - » to put citizens in control

Vision for Kent 2012 - 2022



- ‘to grow the economy’
for Kent to be open for business with a growing, successful economy and jobs for all
- ‘to tackle disadvantage’
for Kent to be a county of opportunity, where aspiration rather than dependency is supported and quality of life is high for everyone
- ‘to put citizens in control’
for power and influence to be in the control of local people so they are able to take responsibility for themselves, their families and communities

Our Sustainable Community Strategy



- The Sustainable Community Strategy for Tunbridge Wells was refreshed alongside the development of the Vision for Kent
- It sets out our long term priorities and the partnership vision for the borough until 2026
- The refreshed strategy was approved by Full Council in October 2011
